Sebastopol Big Garden: A New Community Space is Growing!



Exciting things are happening along the fence line at the Spencer Street entrance of Phoenix P-12 Community College! If you've noticed activity in the area, you've seen the beginnings of the Sebastopol 'Big' Garden—a vibrant new outdoor space being developed by learners from Ballarat Neighbourhood Centre (BNC) and dedicated volunteers.

This initiative is transforming unused land into a blossoming community garden featuring vegetable plots, composting systems, seating areas, and more. Stage One is now complete, with buildings and toilet installed on site. Stage Two—the gardens— are now underway, starting with the Fruity Forest along the fenceline. Sponsored by Bendigo Bank, this foraging space will offer free fresh fruit, greens, and herbs for community members to pick and enjoy.



Garden Plan: We've been working to develop a site plan that includes ideas and suggestions from community members – and can change and grow over time. In the years ahead, the garden will grow to include a greenhouse and nursery, expanded veggie beds, and welcoming spaces for relaxation, learning, and community gatherings. We'd love to see a market, a coffee van, or even a pizza oven in the future—what do you think?

BNC is already running Adult Community Education courses and offering volunteer opportunities for those keen to get involved. Future plans include tours, workshops, and all-abilities activities for people of all ages and backgrounds.

This garden is more than a place to grow food—it's a colourful, inclusive space for community, gardening, and healthy living.




Latest news from Sebastopol Men's Shed

Community feedback for name of new hub in Sebas

Source: City of Ballarat website, retrieved 25/08/25 Residents were invited to have their say on the proposed name for Sebastopol's new community hub before Monday September. 8 The transformational community facility is nearing completion, with an officially registered name now being considered for its expected opening in January 2026. Throughout the project period, the facility has been given the interim name of Sebastopol Community Hub. However, the naming of the facility must be compliant and requires approval from Geographic Names Victoria. The City of Ballarat is proposing to name the facility the Vickers Street Community Hub, with the adjoining educational facility to be known as the Vickers Street Kindergarten.

Why can't it be named the Sebastopol Community Hub?

All names must comply with the Naming Rules for Places in Victoria, as set by Geographic Names Vctoria, before being approved and registered. Advice from Geographic Names Victoria is that there is potential for confusion given there are multiple existing facilities in the suburb that already include Sebastopol in their names. This includes the 'Ballarat South Community Hub, Sebastopol' and the 'Sebastopol South Kindergarten'. This level of repetition can cause confusion for emergency services and the public, potentially leading to safety issues. To ensure clarity and compliance, names must be distinctive, while still being locationally relevant.

The Vickers Street name is proposed as it resonates with the location and is unique to other facilities in Sebastopol. The Vickers Street Community Hub and the Vickers Street Kindergarten would have different registered names, as they are separate facilities the same building. Following sharing consultation period, a reccommendation will be made to Ballarat City Council later this year. Once a proposed name has been adopted by Council, it will be sent to Geographic Names Victoria for approval and registration. Thanks to a small but dedicated team of volunteers, the Connecting Sebastopol Community News reaches over 3000 households in Sebastopol. With approximately 5000 houses in the suburb, there are some residents who are currently missing out. We are seeking to expand our number of newsletter delivery volunteers to ensure every home in the 'Burra' receives a copy of our local news. The newsletter is published four times per year in March, June, September and December. It takes around 1 hour to walk and deliver about 100 newsletters. If you think you may be able to spare 1 hour a few times a year we would love to hear from you! You are welcome to 'try it out' for one issue, and if you decide it's not the right volunteer role for you, there is no commitment. Additionally, if you sign up as a volunteer we understand that you may not be available to deliver every issue. Newsletters can be delivered anytime that suits you, approximately 1-2 weeks of being printed. Volunteers must register with Ballarat Neighbourhood Centre, including submitting a current Working with Children Check which is free to apply for as a volunteer. Some of the key streets / areas where volunteers are needed include:

North of Hertford Street (around Alexandra St, Clarkson St, Yarrowee St)

South of Hertford St (around Tait St, Hill St, Bonshaw Dr, Webster Dr, a small section of Vickers St & Baudinette Dr)

East of Albert Street (around Yarrowee St, Sayle St, Orion St, Wilsons Lane, Kyle St, Westcliffe Cr, Docwra St)

West of Albert Street (Prince St, Nelson St)

Tech Time

Digital Break-In: Why Your Online Password Might Be the Weakest Link

Earlier this year, CyberNews reported a massive leak of 16 billion passwords, and the real danger is that yours might be one of them. According to ABC News Australia (June 2025), cybercrime reports have increased by 23% over the last 12 months, with older Australians being increasingly targeted through phishing scams and fakemessages. Whether you're 18 or 80, if you use the same password across multiple accounts, you're putting yourself at serious risk. And let's be honest, many of us do it.

With everything moving online, it's tough to remember a dozen different passwords, so we reuse the same ones out of convenience. But that very habit is exactly what hackers exploit.

The Most Common Threats

Dr. Vanessa Teague, a cybersecurity expert at the Australian National University, explains that "password reuse is one of the most dangerous habits online (The Conversation, 2024). Hackers use four main techniques:

Phishing: Fake messages pretending to be from Facebook, Instagram, or even the ATO ask you to "verify your account." They look real, but they're not.

Credential Stuffing: If your old Netflix password was leaked, hackers will try it on your email, banking, or MyGov account.

Password Spraying: They try simple passwords like "Australia123" on a mass list of emails.

Brute Force: Software guesses millions of combinations per second, cracking weak passwords in minutes.

How to Stay Safe

The Australian Cyber Security Centre (ACSC) urges people to use strong, unique passwords for every account, at least 12-16 characters, with a mix of letters, numbers and symbols."

A trick? Think of a sentence like: "My first pet was a Dog in 2001" and use the first letters: Mfpwadin2001. Add caps and a symbol, and you've got something solid.

Use password managers (e.g., Google Password Manager, iCloud Keychain) and enable two-factor authentication, especially for accounts like MyGov, banking, and email.

Want to Know If You've Been Hacked?

Check your email on haveibeenpwned.com created by Australian cybersecurity researcher Troy Hunt. It's trusted worldwide and it's free.

Final Word: Your password is like the lock on your digital front door, and hackers are checking every handle. So don't leave it wide open with something like "123456."

Make it strong. Make it unique. Make it uncrackable.

Historically Speaking

News from the Sebastopol Historical Society



Have you wondered what Sebastopol looked like in the olden days? Did you know that some of the richest gold deposits in the country were found under the streets of Sebastopol and Redan? The Borough of Sebastopol has a proud sporting history. Do you know how many different sporting clubs and facilities have been based here? The answers to these questions and more can be found in the rooms of Sebastopol Historical Society. The Historical Society has a museum located on the ground floor of the original Sebastopol State School building in Yarrowee Street behind the Sebastopol Bowling Club. The museum is home to many artefacts and records from Sebastopol organisations and families.

The Society holds an open day on the first Sunday of every month from 1 until 4 pm. Everyone is most welcome to visit and explore the museum. There are volunteers on hand to answer your questions and help with research. The museum is also open by appointment



to individuals or groups wishing to visit. A charge of \$5 per person for adults and \$2 for children. Monies raised go to supporting the work of preserving the suburb's history telling our stories.

We welcome visitors and are very keen to hear their stories about their time in 'the Borough'. On our August open day we had visitors researching their family history, donating treasures they had found or

collected and residents old and new sharing memories and asking questions. One of the most popular exhibits in the museum is a panoramic painting that gives overview of



Sebastopol showing the location of the old mines, hotels, churches and other features. The painting is the work of Arthur Jenkins the inaugural president of the Historical Society. Visitors spend quite a bit of time examining the many details in the painting and looking for familiar features.



The Historical Society is the proud custodian of some important Sebastopol treasures, such as the Sebastopol Football and Netball Club premiership jacket circa the 1950s above.

Some older residents maybe able to identify to which group the Blue Wren pennant above belongs.

School Report

College 40th Anniversary

This year marks the 40th anniversary of Ballarat Christian College, celebrating four decades of service and growth in the Sebastopol community.



The College began its journey in 1985 as a primary school, initially operating on the grounds of the Carmel Welsh Presbyterian Church. Classes were first held in the Bethel Hall, with 22 students enrolled. Modular buildings were purchased and installed on adjacent land leased from the church and toward the end of the first five-year period land was purchased in Vickers Street Sebastopol. Works were undertaken and near the end of 1990 the modular buildings were transported up from Carmel Welsh.

The new site at Vickers Street was opened for the start of the 1991 school year. Later that year, the school's name changed to Sebastopol Christian Community School, to better reflect its new location and attempted to expand their education offering into secondary schooling, but without success. After the second attempt in 1998 failed to gain necessary funding support from the Commonwealth, a small group of parents turned to Christian Schools System to commence a separate Christian secondary school. In 1999, Ballarat Christian College commenced with

leasing the former Seventh-Day Adventist Primary school at 11-13 Yarrowee Street. These five years were busy and exciting years in both schools, but possibly the major focus was on the secondary college as it grew and expanded towards offering a full Year 7 to 12 education.

Midway through 2001 it was evident that there was no longer sufficient space for all the classes at the original site. Land was leased from the primary school and modular buildings installed. For one year the secondary school operated across the two campuses, before fully locating to the site next to the primary school. During 2004-2005 the secondary enrolments grew to just under 100 students. During the latter part of this period, discussions commenced between the two schools about the possibility of merging and the two school Boards unanimously agreed to merge the two schools. The merger was officially affected in January 2007, the 'new' school, known as Ballarat Christian College, was operating effectively as a single school with around 160 students and a teaching staff of 20. Today the College how grown to over 400 students and 70 staff.

The College began to gain a reputation as a viable alternative for parents desirous of their children gaining a quality education that not only was the equal of other Ballarat schools but also offered a Christian distinctive as a normal part of its curriculum.


